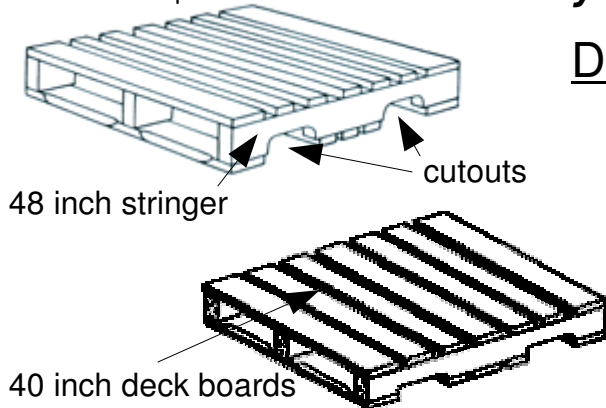


GMA Pallets at Homerville

Examples of good GMA 4-way pallets

Often have 7 top boards & 5 bottom boards



Only GOOD GMA pallets are counted IN or OUT at the Homerville Wholesale Produce Auction by the Dockwalker.

Definition of GOOD 4-way GMA pallets:

- 48 inch stringer and 40 inch deck boards.
- Usually 7 top boards & 5 bottom boards.
- Three (3) stringers or runners. (NOT 4!)
- Must have cutouts on sides for forklift.
- Two or less broken or missing boards.
- Professionally repaired pallets acceptable.

Pallets below are NOT COUNTED in or out by the Dockwalker.

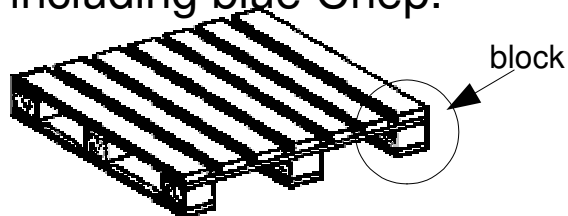
Growers can use these under bins and boxes but don't expect credit. Buyers are currently welcome to leave them at the auction at no charge (and no credit) but they are a **major disposal problem** and expense for the Produce Auction. There may have to be a charge in the future.

Please try not to bring those heavy blue Chep pallets or US Postal Service pallets to the Produce Auction. They are legally owned by a third party.

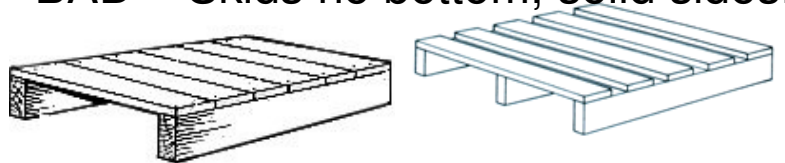
BAD – GMA with 3 or more missing or broken boards.



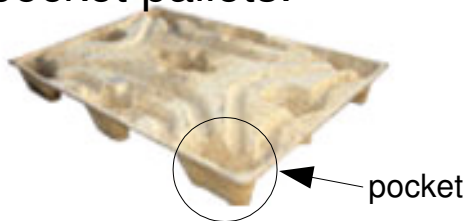
BAD – Block pallets including blue Chep.



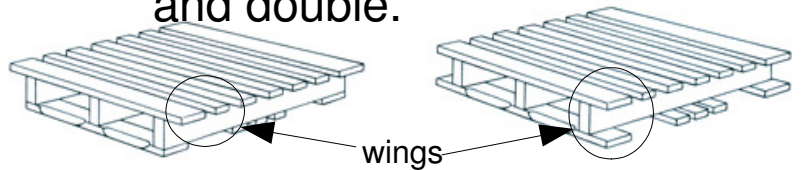
BAD – Skids no bottom, solid sides.



BAD – Pressed board pocket pallets.



BAD – Wing pallets single and double.



BAD - Plastic pocket pallets.



BAD - Lightly built one trip pallets.
